Native Plant Dyes - fs.fed.us Prior to chemical synthesis of indigo dye, blue jeans and cotton were dyed with a blue dye derived from tropical indigo bush, native to India. Mayo indigo, from the Sonoran desert was used for blue dye for thousands of years. Rubber rabbitbrush, a western native, can be used to create both green and yellow dyes. Native Dyes - National Park Service Native Americans used a number of naturally-occurring mordants which include**:

- natural alum precipitated from some drying soils,
- tannic acid from sumac (berries, branches, or leaves),
- lye made from wood ashes, urine, a sheep manure and water mixture, and smoke.
